> WHY CHOOSE SKY SOCCER CLUB ACADEMY



The impact of youth sports on a player's life can be significant. SKY Soccer Club's culture and mission dictates the influence and development of kids as players and people. Our mission at SKY Soccer Club is to develop great players and people and enhance the community we serve.

This is ingrained in all that we do. A college or professional scout will not ask how your player's team finished in the "big" tournament. Instead, technical skill, tactical understanding, academics, maturity and community involvement, will be most important.

Our approach is to influence the whole player through our culture and coaching.

SKY Soccer Club is governed by a board of directors that provides oversight for all SKY programming and activities. The Academy Program is led by our Director of Coaching (DOC). The DOC is responsible for supporting our Academy Teams, Players, Coaches, Managers and Treasurers in a joint effort to provide the highest quality program and experience possible for our players and their families.

Our Club Administrator and Registrar plays a significant role in managing key administrative and compliance components of the the Academy program, including working with KYSA and managing official player administration and rostering.

Each Academy Team will have a Coach, Manager (volunteer) , and Treasurer (volunteer). The Coach and Manager will work together with support from the DOC to schedule practices, friendlies, determine appropriate tournaments, leagues and level of competition for the team. The Manager and Treasurer will work together on the Team budget and communicate Team Fees based on the activities the team will participate in.

Coaches are assigned to teams by the Director of Coaching based on numerous factors. Coaches may change seasonally when circumstances dictate.



PROGRAM INFORMATION > TEAM SELECTION PROCESS

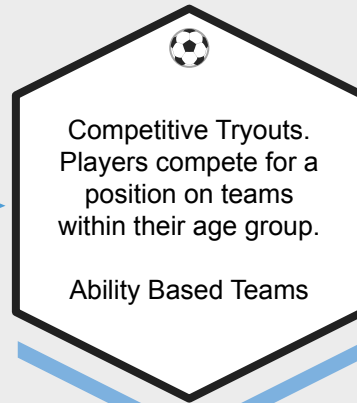


Team selection process varies by age group. Tryouts are required for all age groups to assess players and ensure player placement on age and developmentally appropriate team. **Tryout participation, player ability and offer acceptance are important factors in determining player team placement, number of teams per age group and level of team competition** (league, tournaments, etc.). During tryouts we will hold parent meetings to explain potential directions for each team and age group.

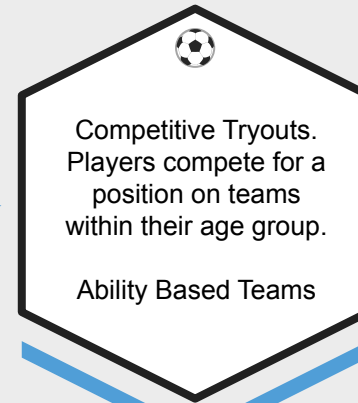

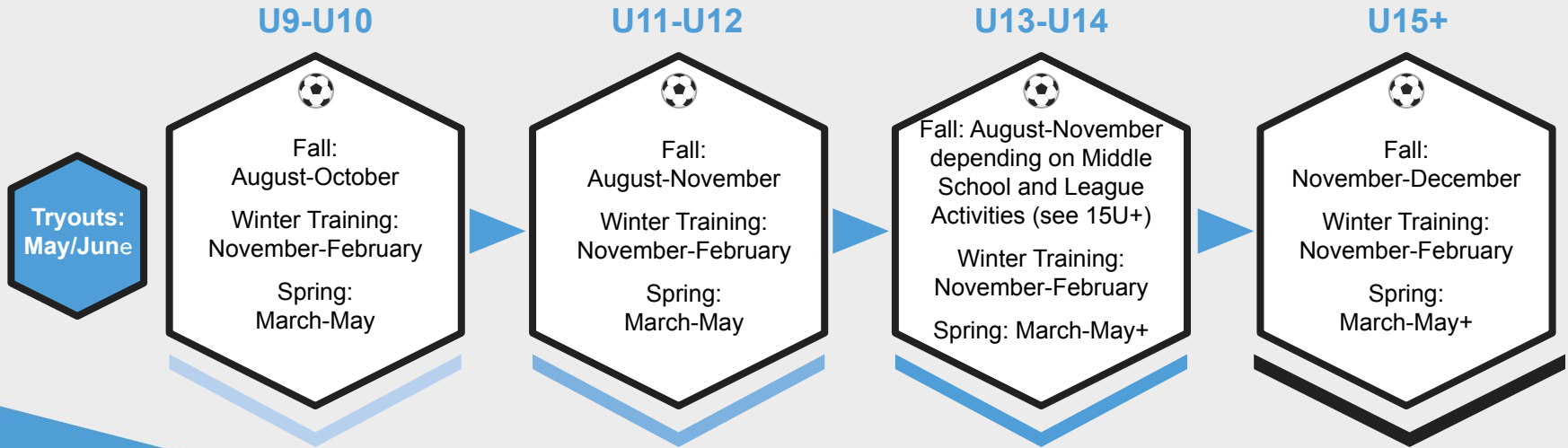

PROGRAM INFORMATION > SEASON SCHEDULE



The Academy season schedule is based on age division, however the commitment is for the “seasonal” year of August through May. Our training and game schedules follow periodization formats with appropriate opportunities for rest and participation in school and other activities. **A seasonal year is broken into 3 seasons: Fall, Winter, Spring.**

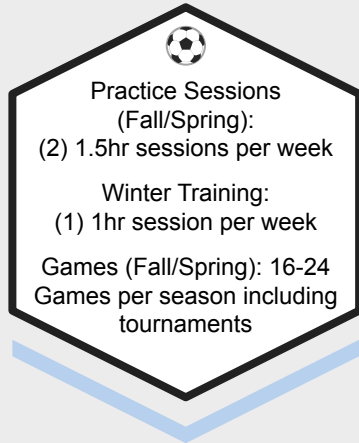


PROGRAM INFORMATION > NUMBER OF SESSIONS AND GAMES



We expect that our Academy teams, while actively in season have three on field “events” per week. An event is a practice session (1.5hrs), a scrimmage, and/or a game. A typical week will consist of two practice sessions and a game day (Saturday/Sunday) that will include 1-2 games. If games are not scheduled we expect that an additional practice session on the weekend is provided. We also offer optional free Goalkeeper and Skills Training sessions throughout the season.

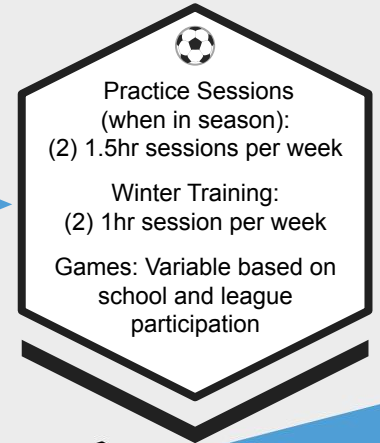

PROGRAM INFORMATION > TRAVEL EXPECTATIONS



When families hear “travel” soccer, they often look at models of other travel sports and think that they’ll be living in hotels and on the road Friday-Sunday every weekend throughout the season, which is not true. In fact, our younger age teams are highly encouraged to keep all game events within a 90 mile radius and attend no overnight tournaments. As players get older and teams earn more competitive League and Tournament opportunities, occasional overnight travel will be required.

SKY is a 501(3)c non-profit organization with open records and bookkeeping for all its members. Fees to participate in the Academy Program are broken down into two primary categories **Club Fees (paid to Club)** and **Team Fees (paid to Team Treasurer)**. It is important to note that many Clubs charge one large fee and then dictate to the teams what and how many events they may participate in. Our approach provides each team with flexibility to engage in more or less activities with a lower overall cost structure, where the team manages their own budget and bank account for the activities they wish to participate in, within guidelines provided by the Club. Our Director of Coaching and Club Administrator oversee the scheduled activities and budgets and provide recommendations based on the team's age and ability to ensure a positive experience and reasonable cost for families.

CLUB FEES

Club Fees include a **Registration Fee** as well as a **Fall Fee** (for teams that play a fall season) and **Spring Fee** which cover Club costs such as, but not limited to: coach compensation, winter training fees, city park field usage fees, facilities and equipment management and maintenance, administration costs the club incurs as an organization with hundreds of academy players, ref assignor fees, Kentucky Youth Soccer Association (KYSA) player/coach registration fees, player insurance fees, etc.

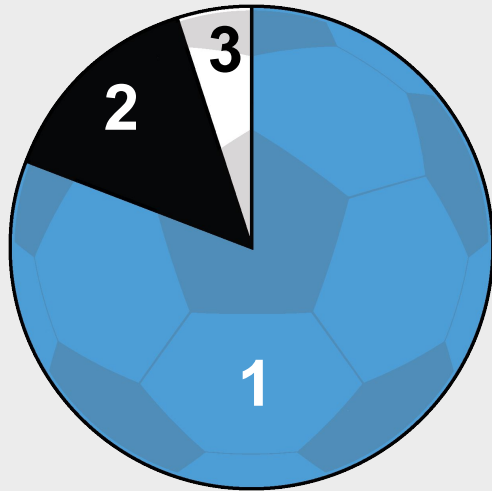
TEAM FEES

Team Fees pay for but are not limited to, referee fees for friendlies, league fees, coaches travel expenses, and team equipment. Team fees are placed in a team bank account and managed by the Team Treasurer. The team treasurer will provide an itemized budget so you know where all the money is being spent.





There are three primary expense categories for the Academy Program that are paid from Club Fees **1) Coaching Staff Fees**, **2) State Affiliate Player Fees**, and **3) Club Admin Costs**. This is the same for players that play for Fall & Spring, or only Spring (older ages).



■ STATE FEES ■ COACHES □ ADMINISTRATIVE



Coaching Staff Fees - 85%, we pay our Academy coaches a scale based on their license/credentials which is comparable to all clubs in the region.



State Affiliate Player Fees 5%, these are paid directly to KYSA on a per player basis each seasonal year and cover USYS, KYSA Affiliate fees and player insurance.



Club Admin Costs (Office, Staff, Field, Equipment, etc.) - 10%, this is the everything it takes to run the soccer club, and it's important to note that the Academy program is allocated 10% of the overall SKY administrative budget whereas 90% of the administrative budget is allocated to recreational programming.





A fee breakdown and estimate is illustrated below by age group. Remember Team Fees are variable and we have listed estimates based on historical information. See [EXPLANATION OF FEES](#) for more information. Flexible payment plans are available. SKY Soccer offers financial aid for our youth soccer programs based on demonstrated need. PROGRAM INFORMATION > COST > UNIFORM INFORMATION



In addition to Club & Team Fees, players are required to purchase the uniform kit. For most players the kit will last two+ years. In an effort to keep overall costs down, the Club works hard to assemble the highest quality uniform, while limiting the components and cost of the required kit.

SKY Soccer Club has a sponsorship agreement with Adidas enabling access to exclusive uniform, coach gear, equipment and other benefits for our Academy program. Uniform cycles are typically only 2 years, however SKY upgraded to custom uniforms in Fall of 2024, allowing further longevity of our current 'style' to eliminate families requirement to purchase new kits every 2 years. Uniforms are purchased via our Adidas retail partner Soccer Village. Instructions for ordering uniforms are provided after tryouts.

Our goal is to make sure all players offered a spot on an Academy Select team are able to play regardless of family financial circumstances. To accomplish this, we offer payment plans and financial assistance to qualifying families. SKY Soccer offers financial aid for our youth soccer programs based on demonstrated need. The SKY Soccer Board of Directors reviews and approves all applications that are completed and forwarded for consideration. All application information is kept 100% confidential. You will be notified when your application has been approved.

REQUIREMENT CHECKLIST FOR ELIGIBILITY

1. Commitment to attend a minimum of 80% of scheduled practices and games.
2. Application must be completed by a parent, guardian, or head of household, with all requested information provided. Incomplete applications will not be considered.
3. All applications are due with your Tryouts Registration through GotSport for the upcoming season. Incomplete or late applications may not be considered

Club Registration & Team Acceptance must be complete for application to be considered. All applicants will be notified of the Board of Directors decision with your Team Offer by June 15th.

Tryout Registration will open in early April. Please be sure to use an email that is accessed regularly.

The tryout process is the same regardless of age group. **You must register in order to be officially recognized as a participant and be eligible to receive an offer for a team, if earned.** Be sure to read about the [TEAM SELECTION PROCESS](#) for a better understanding of the goals of tryouts for different age groups.

Tryout Sessions - There are two sessions per age group, and it is recommended that players attend both sessions, however if you are unable to be at both or either sessions, you should make sure the Director of Coaching (DOC) (doc@skysoccer.org) is aware.

Day of Tryout Session - When you arrive for tryouts you will be asked to sign in, you'll receive your tryout shirt and number bib, and be directed to the appropriate field.

Team Coaches - while we do everything we can to officially assign coaches to teams ahead of tryouts, it is not uncommon for different coaches to run a tryout session. It is also possible, but not typical, that team coaching assignments are changed between the time tryouts take place and the start of the season. This situation is an exception to the rule and we would communicate extensively with the team during this time.

Pro tip - Attention Parents - It is important that we provide a fun and competitive environment for the players and that is achieved by the players and coaches being able to progress through the tryout sessions without distractions. Parents are not permitted to be on or around the field during the tryout sessions. Parents should not attempt to coach or cheer on their players during tryouts. This approach creates a less intimidating atmosphere for the players and allows them to show their talents and willingness to compete while having fun.

[WHAT HAPPENS AFTER TRYOUTS?](#)





When tryouts are over the Coaching staff and Director of Coaching work together to determine which players should be placed on which teams based on various criteria.

Outcomes of tryouts:

Not Selected - you will be notified via email if you haven't been accepted on a team. Player development and experience is our number one priority at SKY. If you are not selected for a team you are welcome to discuss the outcome with our Director of Coaching and seek information on programs, skills and other opportunities for player development at SKY.

Accepted - Reserve/Practice Player - If not selected for the "full" team, you may be offered a spot as a reserve, or practice player, and details about this role will be provided.

Accepted - Full Team - you will be notified via email that you have been selected for a team via email in the form of an official acceptance and offer message. [OFFER ACCEPTANCE INSTRUCTIONS](#)

Offers - Offers are usually sent to all registered participants via email within 48hrs and you are required to accept or decline your offer within 48hrs of receipt. This includes paying the Club registration fee. See [PROGRAM INFORMATION>COST](#) section for details.



HOW TO JOIN > OFFER ACCEPTANCE INSTRUCTIONS



Based on the [OUTCOME OF TRYOUTS](#), offers will be sent out via email for acceptance. At this time the system will ask you to set up your payment plan for the seasonal year. You can find the cost breakdown [HERE](#). A few things you need to have on hand when accepting your offer:

- ★ Birth Certificate (or other proof of birth i.e.: passport)
- ★ Headshot of Player (used for player card, best if shoulder up)
- ★ Health Insurance Information (used for Medical release form)

Once your offer is Accepted and teams are officially formed, you will receive information via email about season start dates, practice days and times, and other important seasonal details.

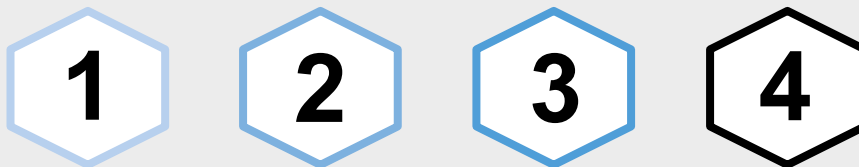
PARENT RESOURCES > DON'T WAIT, ASK NOW!



A common theme among parents, players and coaches is to expect that concerns will go away by talking about them on the sidelines during practices and games. To the contrary, this approach generates more questions, more concerns and dissatisfaction that is not in alignment with our commitment to providing our players and families the best possible experience and delivering a fun, safe and competitive instructional environment. While we ask that our coaches and team managers regularly communicate with parents and players about team goals and expectations, during the flow of a season parents and players often have questions or concerns. DIRECTOR OF COACHING

Our Director of Coaching is here to support our Academy Program's coaches, players and families. **DO NOT HESITATE TO REACH OUT TO OUR DIRECTOR OF COACHING.** Our DOC has decades of experience and can answer your questions and assist you and your coach to resolve issues you have.

COACH

Have your player speak to the coach or schedule time with the coach to speak with them with your player. Use the "24-hour rule" - do not address questions/concerns for 24hrs after a game or from when a situation arises. If you email the coach, feel free to copy the Director of Coaching doc@skysoccer.org, so they can assist the coach with resolution.

PARENT RESOURCES > GLOSSARY OF TERMS



Academy: Academy style training focuses on developing core fundamental technical skills for the individual through appropriate levels of competition to prepare young players for future individual and team success.

Academy Select: Academy Select is our most competitive programming and is focused on the next level of player technical development along with team tactical growth to achieve results at the highest level of competition possible.

DOC (Director Of Coaching): The DOC is responsible for the evaluation and development of club coaches as well as player evaluation and overall Academy and Academy Select methodology and culture.

Friendly (pl. friendlies): Also known as classic matches. A game(s) played against a team(s) from another soccer club. Friendlies do not have a trophy or other sort of award at the end. Friendlies tend to only be against two other teams, but maybe three teams might play in a Friendly; these other teams might all come from one club/city, or from multiple clubs/cities.

Guest Playing: A player permanently rostered to one team is allowed to play with another team for one game or tournament. Guest playing for a non-SKY team will require team coach and DOC approval.

Modified parity: The ability to divide players into two, three or more teams based on differing competition levels or brackets in a tournament.

Playing up: When a player plays with an older age group. Ex. a true U13 player is placed on a U14 team. A player “playing up” is typically a permanent member of the team where a guest player only participates for one game or tournament but is rostered to a different team.

Pool Play: A format used in tournaments to determine placement for semi-finals and/or finals.

Seasonal year: Runs Fall – Spring. The “Seasonal Year”, meaning August through late May. The fall season begins in August and runs through mid to late November. The spring season begins in mid-February and runs through late May. U9-U14’s play both fall and spring. U15 and up, boys and girls play in spring only, but can have a late fall season (November and December) depending on the team.

Stratification: Process of player placement based on ability

Tournaments: These are more self-explanatory. It is important to note that a tournament may start on Friday night and go through Sunday. Typically, teams play 3-4 games during a tournament weekend and on average three tournaments a season (including our own). The approved tournament list will be provided by the DOC. If your team would like to attend a tournament that is not listed, please contact your DOC for approval.

Tryouts: Tryouts are held in late May/early June each year and teams for the following seasonal year are formed each year at this time.

Winter Season/Training: Typically November – February. Indoor training and tournaments for each team follow the guidelines provided by the DOC.
